Tips for Client when Selecting an Electrical Contractor

- 1. Before reaching out to an Electrical Contractor, outline the details of your project that will include what your expectations are for that project and when you would like it to be completed. Providing this information to the Electrical Contractor company will help them create a more accurate estimate for you.
 - a. SOMETHING TO CONSIDER: A small deposit may be necessary to purchase most materials need to start projects.
 - b. Ensure Electrical Company is Active on SunBiz.org and DBPR (Department of Business and Professional Regulation) website to ensure legitimacy of company and protection for client.
 - i. Electrical work requires specialized knowledge and a degree of expertise to avoid any damage or issues to person and/or property.
 - ii. If the company is on the DBPR website then they have the appropriate General Liability and Worker Compensation needed to be a contractor within the State of Florida.
- 2. Contact an Electrical Contractor company so they may decide whether or not a permit may be required for this project then they will be able to give you a timeline to complete the project.
 - a. It always in the best interest as a client to gather at least 3 estimates for your project to ensure you are hiring the company that meets all your project expectations.
- 3. Ask the Electrical Contractor company how their projects/jobs are priced. Some Electrical Contractor charge for jobs per hour or some will quote a flat per project price.
- 4. Are you planning on selling your home? Then contact a Electrical Contractor or refer to your real estate agent to make any small updates that could make your home stand out from or with others on the market.
